ENCLAVE BUTTERFLY GARDEN CELEBRATION TO BE HELD APRIL 27TH. 2024

Fall Creek's Enclave Butterfly Garden is now a reality! Located by the pool at The Enclave at Fall Creek, or by "the small pool," as it's called, the Enclave Butterfly Garden provides over 700 square feet of butterfly nectar plants, such as lantana, and butterfly host plants, such as milkweed.

Go by and see the new garden when you get a chance. The new plants are still small, since they're newly planted, but by spring they will be larger. Within a year or two, the garden should be completely filled in with flowers and foliage.

Butterflies are challenged right now due to this summer's record-breaking heat and drought, which diminishes the availability of nectar and caterpillar host plants, so this is the perfect time for Fall Creek to be putting in a butterfly garden.

Join us and learn more about butterflies at the Ribbon Cutting for Enclave Butterfly Garden on Saturday, April 27th, where the Fall Creek Landscape Committee will be hosting garden tours, a butterfly costume contest, and activities.

FALL CREEK'S LANDSCAPING CLEANUP GUIDELINES

Fall is here, and the change in color and (hopefully) temperature brings about a renewed motivation to spruce up the exterior of the home and make a positive contribution to the appearance of our community. Our landscaping management team has already provided us with some useful tips to get a jump on seasonal lawn maintenance, but the job doesn't end there. A beautifully manicured lawn and perfectly pruned hedges aren't possible without making a bit of a mess. You may find yourself wondering what to do with all the leftovers – tree limbs, grass clippings, and dead leaves – and all too often, this debris is being left on sidewalks or in the street, where it is washed down into the storm drains. Not only does this detract from the appeal of the community, but it can also lead to pollution of local waterways and serious flooding.

Fortunately, Fall Creek's trash collection company is in the community every Wednesday and Saturday to help get the job done. The Best Trash crew picks up heavy trash alongside regular trash on each scheduled service day and strives to finish their route as quickly and safely as possible. We can do our part to help them achieve this goal by keeping the following guidelines in mind:

Tree Limbs, Shrub & Brush Trimmings: Tie into clearly separated bundles, each weighing 40lbs or less. Limbs may not exceed a length of 4 feet or a diameter of 3 inches. Up to 5 bundles will be collected per service day. Disposing of these items directly into the trashcan poses a safety hazard for the crew and may result in a missed pickup.

Leaves, Grass Clippings, & Small Debris: Securely bag these items and leave them at the curb for collection. Each bag should weigh 40lbs or less, and up to 5 bags will be collected per service day. Please note that debris or waste left behind by a contracted landscaper are the responsibility of the landscaper to remove. Alternatively, Best Trash can be contacted to arrange a special pickup.

Dirt, Sod, Mulch, Rocks & Bricks: These items are not included in the service and should not be left at the curb.

SUMMER LAWN RECOVERY

It goes without saying, Summer of 2023 has been tough. The extreme heat and lack of rain has taken a toll on lawns across the Houston area. As the fall season approaches, Will Hoppe, Member Course Superintendent at Golf Club of Houston, has a couple of simple recommendations to help your lawn recover from the summer stress.

- Raise the height of cut on your lawn mower to the highest setting to allow the grass to keep more plant tissue for the winter.
- Weed and Feed NOW! Put a high-quality fall fertilizer with weed control on your lawn YESTERDAY! He said, "We still have a month
 (maybe more) of growing weather before grass starts to shut down for the winter." Be sure to water-in the herbicide with enough water to
 get the product down into the soil.
- Don't panic if you have grass that went into summer dormancy or looks dead. With rain and the fertilizer that you apply now, those areas will start to green up and the herbicide will help prevent weeds from emerging.

Unfortunately, some areas that received significant damage may require additional care and treatment next spring – including additional aerification, fertilizer treatments, and in the worst cases, new sod to aid in recovery of larger areas. Let's hope that this is not the case, and let's pray for some nice fall weather very soon!

BOO FALL CREEK FRIENDS AND NEIGHBORS

Halloween is one of the most anticipated nights of the year for kids, but research shows some scary statistics* on Halloween & Trick or Treating safety:

- Children are more than twice as likely to be hit by a car and killed on Halloween than any other day of the year.
- Unfortunately, 12% of children under the age of 5 are permitted to Trick or Treat alone
- 63% of children do not carry a flashlight or wear reflective tape
- 52% of motor vehicle deaths on Halloween involve alcohol
- The U.S. Consumer Product safety commission estimates an average of 3,200 Halloween-related injuries happen every year.
 Stat Breakdown:
 - Pumpkin carving attributes to 55%.
 - Falls while decorating or tripping over costumes contribute to 25%.
 - Miscellaneous situations like lacerations, ingestion, and other injuries relating to costumes, pumpkins, decorations, or allergic reactions contribute to 20%.

Fortunately, a few simple precautions can make it a safe night for everyone!

Top 10 Tips for Staying Safe on Halloween

- 1. Always be aware of your surroundings and use safety precautions while Trick or Treating.
- 2. Make sure you can see! Wear well-fitting masks, costumes, and shoes to avoid blocked vision, trips and falls.
- 3. Use reflective tape, flashlights or Glow sticks to be more visible to drivers.
- 4. Use the buddy system or walk in groups while Trick or Treating. Small children should walk with their parents or a trusted adult, never alone.
- 5. Stay on the sidewalks and cross the street in groups. Remember to look both ways when crossing streets.
- 6. Only approach well-lit houses with porch lights on. Never enter a stranger's house unless with a trusted adult.
- 7. Wait until returning home before eating any candy. Parents should examine all candy prior to allowing children access to eating.
- 8. Never accept rides from a stranger.
- 9. Eliminate distractions by keeping cell phones in a safe place while walking.
- 10. If you see something suspicious, report it. Save the Harris County Sheriff's Office Non-Emergency Phone Number in your phone. (713) 221-6000 Option 1.

Lastly, **motorists – SLOW DOWN** and be especially alert while driving within the neighborhood. Children are excited on Halloween and pedestrian traffic may be more unpredictable.

Popular trick-or-treating hours are 5:30PM to 9:30PM. Residents, please leave the porch or garage light on if you are distributing candy.

Whether or not you're Trick or Treating this year, we can all do our part to keep Halloween a spooky safe & frighteningly fun time!







